the price paid was 3c more per pound for each. But what of meat? The same retail firm says that in its Montreaf stores the average cost of fresh meats, beef, veal, lambs and pork, is 30c a hundred higher this year than last. In its Toronto stores it is 63c a hundred higher, and in its Ontario stores, Oshawa, Kingston, Brantford, Woodstock, St. Thomas and Collingwood, it is 62c higher. The firm is making 2 per cent. less on its turnover to the consumer than a year ago. The wholesalers have been paying from 2c to 4c a pound more all season than they paid for beef last Christmas. Hogs were bought at \$6.10 and \$6.15 per cwt. in November last. Now they cost \$504, live weight. In December last pork was plen-tiful at \$5.85. Incidentally it might be well to note that beef struck the highest mark in Chicago this week that has been reached in 27 years. So we'll have to overlook the roast boar's head proposition for our Yule-tide feast. Plain turkey or roast goose will be the bill of fare. JURISPRUDENCE OF EMPIRE

His Honor Judge Denton spoke on "The Jurisprudence of the Empire" to the Empire Club yesterday, Dr. Ex-Clouse, the new president, occupying the chair for the first time." It was not of the science of law in the abstract, but of the different systems of law in the empire, that the speaker wished to speak. It had always been the aim of Britain to continue as far as possible the customs of the peoples who came under the control of the empire. The Romans insisted in im-posing their own code on all conquered peoples. Napoleon spread his code thruout his empire. The British policy was, therefore, a new one. Some said Britain fad gone too far and been too generous with her conquered subjects, but the verdict of history was differ-ent.

Int, Canada, with the exception of Que-bec, was under British common law. Quebec came into the British empire before the time of Napoleon, so that the law there was based on old French custom.

The supreme court of the whole em-pire was the judicial committee of the privy council. Judge Denton described, the rise and development of this com-mittee as finally established in 1833. There were usually eight or ten law lords upon it, admittedly the greatest legal minds in England. There must always be at least four of these lards sitting in the dingy court in White-hall.
