

UNIVERSITY CHURCHS ROBIN FOR HERBERT D. HILL

Further Particulars of the Double Drowning Accident at the Soo.

Herbert Delamere Hill, who was drowned at the Soo, was born in Stratford, Ont., on the 24th of 1871.

After his graduation in classics he entered the Imperial Bank. Late last fall he was transferred to St. Catharines.

During his course at the university, "Canon," as he was most frequently called, endeavored himself to all who knew him.

He was a most generous and generous to a fault, he had a wide circle of sincere friends among the students of the faculty and outside of the college.

His is the first death to break the ranks of the year of '04.

The fact that he died yesterday morning, when his death had become known among his friends in Toronto, one of them received a letter, stating that he was coming to Toronto next week to spend his vacation.

The letter had been written on Wednesday evening, and the fact that he had not yet returned is expected that a large number from various parts of the province will attend the funeral at St. Thomas.

The other young man, James Colebrook Patterson, was the son of Hon. J. C. Patterson, ex-lieutenant-governor of Ontario.

Further particulars received from the World's correspondent at the Soo show that the accident occurred in St. Mary's River, near Topssal Island, at about 10 o'clock on the evening of the 21st.

The victims were inexperienced boatmen, and it is doubtful if they realized the danger incurred in going out on a sailboat race, in spite of the fact that a gale of 60 miles an hour was coming off Lake Superior, and white caps were running at least six feet high.

Warned Not to Go. After banking hours, young Hill called on his father, Mr. Hill, and his companion, and Manager Roberts of the bank warned them that it was dangerous to go out on the lake.

The boat was suddenly capsized, and both young men were thrown overboard. The search party, which was organized at 10 o'clock yesterday morning, but no trace of either of the bodies had been found at a late hour last night.

The young men disappeared at once, and neither body has been found. The caretaker at the boat house put out at once in a small skiff, but the waves were running at such a height that he was unable to turn back.

A few minutes later a party put out in C. Shields' gasoline launch, which was followed by a number of other boats. The canoe was picked up later in the evening by a tug farther down the river. The search party, which has been out since 4 o'clock yesterday morning, but no trace of either of the bodies had been found at a late hour last night.
