

We are greatly in need of a covered shed for play and drill in inclement weather, as some of the sickness recorded has been due to exposure.

The drainage and water supply has been treated very fully in the report of the committee appointed by the Provincial Board of Health. I fully concur in the suggestion offered, and believe the expense in that connection will well repay.

We have now to deal with a large Institution whose needs have increased in proportion to the numbers. We have secured the service of a trained nurse, who is always on duty to look especially after sickness, and which takes a great responsibility of the matron of each cottage, whose duties are sufficiently arduous without having to care for the sick.
