The Chicago Teams Are Now First in C. B. A. Tourney

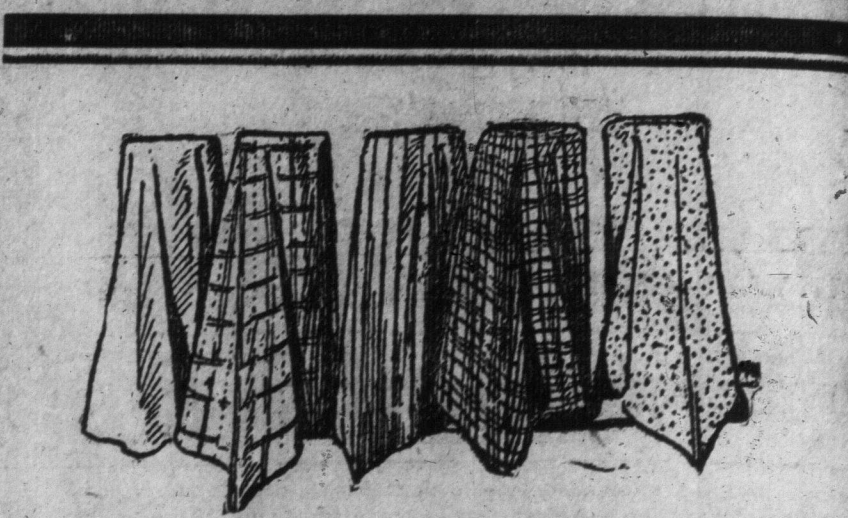
