Sir,

This evening - at my house - I received Mr. VanKoughnets telegram: - "David Almas asks for countermand of order for removal of Whites on tenth inst. - Report particulars at once".

In reply, I have to state, that in accordance with your standing order or instructions, and the approval of the Indian Council, I issued, and had served upon all trespassers on the Indian Reserve, a printed notice (which I forwarded to you) to remove from the Reserve by the 1st December, - but having learned, the notice was not complied with, and that two of those who had been turned off by the Sheriff, had actually returned to the Reserve, though aware of the consequences of so doing, - I resolved to again issue warrants of removal, but considerably deferred doing so until the weather became fine, with good roads.

Having before tried the effect of a few warrants of removal, in the hope that others would take the hint and depart, - that failing, and the evil increasing with newcomers, the only course left, was to
