Read and re-Enacted the following Laws:

A Law to regulate the Fisheries within the  
limits of the City of Saint John.

A Law to regulate Public Porters and Hand-  
Carriers in the City of Saint John, on the Eastern  
side of the Harbour.

A Law establishing the rates to be taken for  
anchorage within the Harbour of the City of Saint  
John.

A Law further to regulate the Inspection of Fish  
within the City of Saint John.

A Law to prevent persons Blasting Rock and  
Earth without using a sufficient Shield or covering  
to prevent danger to life.

A Law to prohibit and reward a Law intituled A  
Law to regulate the Public Ships, Landing Places,  
and Shores or Beaches within the City of Saint  
John.

A Law to regulate the Gaging and Inspection  
of Oil in the City of Saint John.

A Law to regulate the Gaging of Wine, Rum,  
Brandy, Madeira, Sherry, and Molasses.

An Ordinance to regulate the measurement  
of Salt and Coal within the City of Saint John.

A Law for the due observance of the Lord's Day,  
commonly called Sunday.

A Law to regulate Cartmen and to establish the  
rates of Cartage within the City of Saint John.

A Law to regulate the sale of Lime within the  
City of Saint John.

A Law regulating the sale of Bread within the  
City of Saint John.

A Law for the due observance of Venus being at  
Anchors and at the Wharves within the City of Saint  
John; and for establishing the duties of the  
Mariner Master of the said City.

A Law to prevent Nuisances in the city of St.  
John.

A Law to regulate the Weighing of Hay in the  
City of Saint John.

An Ordinance to regulate the office of Port or  
Harbour Master within the City of Saint John.
