CRY FOR POLITICAL REFORM IN CHINA

Last Session of Diet Was Noisy One - Clamor for Extension of Franchise to Young Men.

(Associated Press Correspondence.) Tokio, Sept. 2.-Public opinion, as voiced in the Japanese press, is far from satisfied with the character of the pro ceedings in the session of the Diet just closed and is particularly condemnatory of the failure to take better advantages of opportunities to push constitutional development. Speeches in the House of Representatives, especially by some of the younger members, showed the existence of a movement of liberalism but the pages its hitter over

showed the existence of a movement of liberalism, but the press is bitter over the fact that the opposition parties failed to make use of their power in a manner sufficient to exact reforms.

A review of the session of the House of Representatives shows that it was noisy, even riotous in nature, that, besides the question of granting universal suffrage, it devoted itself to matters of a transitory or personal nature and that a transitory or personal nature and that with the exception of the well-known liberal, Yukio Ozaki, there was no party attack on militarism or military infl

attack on militarism or military influence which is still regarded as being all powerful in Japan.

It is evident, however, that a beginning has been made in voicing the popular cry for political reforms, this being especially noticeable in the pressing clamor of the suffragists that all the young man of the surprise begiven the young men of the empire be given the right to vote and that, in a general way, liberty of speech within and without the Diet shall be absolutely guaran-
