MISS HELEN DUNECE AND GUY H. TAYLOR IN ARTISTIC CONCERT

While the audience which assembled last evening in the York Theatre at the recital given by Miss Helen Dunece, soprano, of New York, and Guy Holly Taylor, tenor, of this city, was not so large as the merits of the programme warranted, it was deeply appreciative of the delights of the evening, and was quick to realize that a distinctly rare treat was being accorded all music lovers present.

Had the weather been more agreeable, many more would probably have attended. The recital was greatly enjoyed. Miss Dunece and Mr. Taylor are both pupils of Professor J. D. Mehan of New York, and Miss Dunece has won popular favor with the audience, and showed marked improvement in vocalization since he was last heard here in public. His treatment of the subject was accurate and well merited the applause given.

Miss Dunece then sang a group of four numbers. Her rendering of them revealed distinct artistic taste. The pretty idyll by Edward MacDowell was, perhaps, most appreciated, providing, as it did, the opportunity for displaying the remarkable flexibility of her voice.

A group of three numbers, "My Star," "My Snowy Breasted Pearl," and "What Care I?" formed Mr. Taylor's next contribution, the execution of the latter showing that the vocalist possesses a voice of unusual range and volume, with the capacity of distinctness in enunciation.

The singing of this group was much appreciated. Then came a delightful rendering by Miss Dunece of Verdi's difficult aria, "A Fors E Lui." In tones of much beauty the artist showed that she was able to respond to every demand of the composer, the clearness of her sustained notes being of a high order.

A recitation and aria from Sullivan's "Come ye Children," given by Mr. Taylor with good effect, was followed by a group of four morceaux, all sung by Miss Dunece with due attention to artistic detail, and with any variation, it may be remarked, of tiredness on the part of the soloist. "Fairy Pipes" was exceptionally pleasing in this group.

The pleasant and high-class musical even was brought to a close by the singing of a group of three songs by Mr. Taylor, his rendering of "Macushla" being very fine.
