### ARE CONSTRUCTING LARGE POWER PLANT

Hydro Development Nearing Completion in South America.

Rio De Janeiro, May 26—(Associated Press)—What is said to be the largest hydro-electric power development in South America ds now nearing completion on the Parahyba River near this city. For more than two years an organization of about 3,000 men, under the direction of a staff of American engineers and construction men, has been building dams, canals, power-house, and transmission lines which will generate and distribute 162,000 electric horsepower over a large zone in this part power over a large zone in this part of Brazil.

### TORONTO HYDRO RATE RAISED; GAS IN HALIFAX MORE

Announcement has been made that on June 1 an increase in the hydro rate would be put in force in Toronto. The minimum floor charge will be increased from 80 cents to 45 cents, and the rate for current will be two cents per k. w. h. for the first 90 hours instead of two cents for the first 30 hours as at present. All over 90 hours will be one cent per k. w. h., as at present. Halifax Gas Boosted.

An increase in the rates for gas and street cars for Halifax was authorized by the Nova Scotia Utilities Board, to go into effect on June 1. The car fare has been increased from seven to ten cents for single fare and six tickets for 50 cents instead of four for 25 cents. A monthly permit can be purchased for \$1 which enables the holder to purchase single tickets for five cents. The gas rate has been increased to a maximum of \$1.90 and a minimum of \$1 per thousand cubic feet.

IMPROVE DIESEL TRANSMISSION

Hamburg, May 26—(Associated Press)—A local firm of ship builders has turned out a motor boat with new wheel equipment that is said to solve the problem of transferring power from the Diesel motor the shaft without vibration. The inventors claim also that their system results in the delivery of more power.


