

and permanence of the institution. The motion passed unanimously.

The second resolution was moved by Rev. J. J. Teasdale—

Resolved, That the thanks of the meeting be given to the ladies and friends, who contributed to the success of the Bazaar, and also to the Provincial Government, City Council, Churches, Sabbath Schools and other societies and friends who in the past year have given generously of their means to support the Home, and also to the press for continued sympathy and help.

He was sure that those who laboured in a cause such as this had the Divine approval, and this assurance in their hearts was the highest reward. Some of the churches are still lacking in the duty of supporting the Infants' Home; but the number would become fewer year by year. He would rejoice to see Sabbath Schools devising and doing liberal things for the Home. He invoked the Divine blessing on the ladies who gave their time and energies to the work. The Lord reward them!

Seconded by Rev. J. F. Avery, who spoke of the amazing pertinacity with which the Devil's agents strive to ruin souls, and the blessed results flowing from reformatory efforts.

The resolution was adopted.

Mr. Murray moved and Dr. Saunders seconded the following resolution:—

Resolved, That the thanks of the meeting be expressed to the committee of ladies to whose untiring zeal and industry, by the blessing of God, the Home owes its success.

Mr. MURRAY explained that the death rate though higher than on several previous years was yet lower than in other similar institutions, where the rate ran up to 40, 50, or 95 per cent!

Dr. SAUNDERS spoke of the excellent results of adopting the children. He had himself witnessed interesting proofs of success in this line. He referred to the horrors of infanticide which the Home had done so much to abate. The chief support must come from those who have the love of Christ in their hearts.
