Complimentary Dinner to the Hon. Peter Mitchell. A number of the citizens of Chatham honored our representative in the Commons by tendering him a public dinner on Wednesday evening last, which was held at the "Canada House," and was a very successful and enjoyable affair.

After due attention had been given to the excellent repast, the second part of the programme was entered upon, the Chairman requesting the company to prepare for the first toast—"The Queen, God Bless her." A verse of the National Anthem was sung, and the company then proceeded to the close of the first verse the strain was taken up by the Band in the sitting room, and repeated by them, which will always be a happy occasion.

Lord Dufferin, the Governor-General of Canada, was next on the list, and in his introductory remarks the chairman said that they would all agree with him that Lord Dufferin was a fine man, and was worthy of the position he held, but he hoped that if they had a Governor-General of Canada who would soon be a native of her soil occupying this high position, and though Lord Dufferin was a very talented man, he felt that a native of Canada would be found equally capable of filling this responsible position.

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Mr. Mitchell was well able to intelligently present the opinions of the people, and consequently held their own. The people of this County looked back to the old representative with feelings of pride. He would mention some of the names most prominently connected with our history. The Hon. Richard Croker, Alex. Rankin, Esq., were names remembered with respect.

Richard Croker, though not an orator, did not speak with silver tongue, yet so man could be pointed out who took a greater interest in the affairs of this County than he did. Robinson Croker also creditably represented his constituents in the Commons. Coming down still later in his own time, he was a pleasure in his position, and he to his late lamented friend, John M. Johnson, whose brilliant talents were always prominently put forth when the interests of the County were at stake.

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
