

PRESIDENT MCKINLEY

Shot Twice on Friday While at the Big Buffalo Exposition.


His Wounds Are Very Serious, Although Not Necessarily Fatal—The Would-be Assassin an Avowed Anarchist of Polish-German Extraction.

BUFFALO, N. Y., Sept. 8.—President McKinley was shot and seriously wounded by a would-be assassin while holding a reception in the Temple of Music at the Pan-American...

The following bulletin was issued by the President's physicians at 10.45 p. m.: "The President is rallying satisfactorily and is resting comfortably. At 10.15 p. m. temperature, 100.4 degrees; pulse, 124; respiration, 24."

THE SECOND BULLET WAS PRODUCED FOR. The walls of the abdomen were opened, but the ball was not located. The incision was hastily closed, and after a brief and hasty consultation it was decided to remove the patient to the home of President Milburn.



OZOLGOSZ WOULD-BE ASSASSIN OF PRESIDENT MCKINLEY

(The full name of the would-be assassin is Leon Frank Czolgosz, pronounced "Chozigosh." He is nearly 28 years old, was born in Detroit and has a father, mother, seven brothers and two sisters.)

OFFICIAL BULLETIN

MILBURN HOUSE, BUFFALO, Sept. 9.—The following bulletin was issued by the President's physicians at 9.30 P. M. "The President's condition continues favorable. Pulse, 112; temperature, 101; respiration, 27."

BUFFALO, N. Y., Sept. 8.—Throughout the quiet Sabbath every word that came from the Milburn residence, where President McKinley lies basking for life, was reassuring, and tonight the confidence expressed in the President's recovery seemed almost too sanguine. Dr. Charles McBurney, the famous New York surgeon, who had been summoned for consultation, after a thorough examination in which he said he had not found a single unfavorable symptom, joined in the last afternoon bulletin, which declared that the President's

CONDITION WAS SATISFACTORY to all the president's physicians present.

AT THE PRESIDENT'S CHURCH. WASHINGTON, Sept. 8.—The exhortations of life are not that no man living can count upon the continuance of existence for any length of time.

ONLY TEN YEARS. NEW YORK, Sept. 6.—President McKinley's recovery would mean that his would-be assassin could be confined in prison for the longest term of the maximum penalty under the penal code for New York state. Two methods of procedure could be adopted. The prisoner could be arraigned before a justice of Erie county and he could demand a retrial and would have the right to counsel and time to prepare his defense.
