John McCallum passed away at his home in New River, Wednesday, at the age of 77 years. The deceased was universally respected, and his death is deeply regretted by his friends and neighbors. The funeral was held Friday, interment being in the new Catholic cemetery in St. George.

The funeral was under the auspices of Court Petrolia No. 42. L. O. E. of which he was a member. Rev. R. J. Garbutt, pastor of the Methodist Church conducted the service.

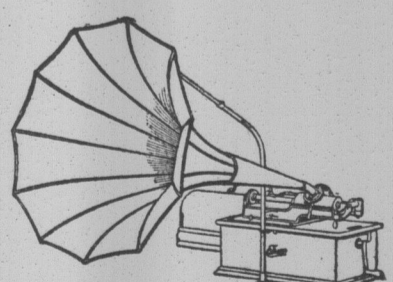
