JUVENILE ROBBER

COMMITTED TO JAIL

His Companion Got Off with
a Reprimand - Electric Car
Service - F. C. Clements Has
Idea for Line.

Fredericton, Feb. 22.—Frank Smith,
the young boy who was arrested on
Tuesday, charged with stealing the
sum of \$19 from a man named King,
appeared before Colonel Marsh at the
police court this morning and was sen-
tenced to serve one month in the
county jail. A man named Gibson,
who was implicated with Smith in the
robbery, was present, but was let
go with a severe reprimand. Two
other young fellows, to whom Smith
had given the stolen money, also ap-
peared, accompanied by their mothers
and received a lecture from Colonel
Marsh.

An Indian appeared for giving liquor
to a thirteen year old squaw, and Col-
marsh released him, it being the first
time that he had appeared in court.

Announcement was made this morn-
ing of names of six of the candidates
who will be among the members of
the ticket to oppose the present City
Council. They are: For Wellington
ward, Moses Mitchell and R. T. Baird;
St. Ann's ward, A. H. Vanwart and
John J. Weathers; Queens ward, D. J.
Shea; Kings ward, W. G. Clark.

A petition is being circulated today,
and is being largely signed, asking
Mayor Thomas to be a candidate for
alderman from Kings ward.

Frank Del. Clements arrived from
St. John last evening and today is
attending the formal organization
meeting of the Springhill Equals
Lands Co., which is being held at
Springhill. The following are the offi-
cers of the new company: President,
F. Del. Clements; manager, S. B.
Hathaway; secretary-treasurer, Miss
F. L. Clements. This morning Mr.
Clements stated that the purchase of
the Hible estate would be completed
probably be consummated today, Mr.
Geo. E. Howie having arrived in the
city a day or two ago in that connec-
tion. It is expected that the plans of
the Seely property will be completed
by the surveyors so that lots can be
placed on the market by March 15th.

Mr. Clements' latest project is arrang-
ing for an electric car service be-
tween this city and Springhill, a dis-
tance of five miles. It is believed that
an electric car service would be large-
ly patronized by residents of the dis-
trict, as well as deriving a patronage
in summer months from camp owners
so that in one way and another a
profitable business would be worked
up. The proposition is to purchase
a storage battery car and secure run-
ning rights over the St. John Valley
rails. It is understood that arrange-
ments are already progressing favor-
ably for the consummation of the pro-
ject. A car such as proposed would
cost about \$12,000, and it is expected
to have the service in operation by
some time next summer, perhaps as
early as July, but not later than Sep-
tember.

The case of Mann vs. St. Croix Pa-
per Company was continued this morn-
ing in the supreme court. On the ad-
journment yesterday afternoon Mr.
Baker and the attorney general had
concluded their argument on behalf of
the defendant and on the opening of
court today N. Mark Mills opened
on behalf of the plaintiff. He was
followed by M. G. Todd, K. C. on the
same side. The case was concluded at
noon and the court adjourned until to-
morrow afternoon when judgments will
be delivered.

R. Hocken, of Pictou, N. S., inspec-
tor of highways, arrived at the Barker
House last evening. He came here as
the result of arrangements made by O.
S. Crockett, M. P., with the marine and
fisheries department, and was met last
evening at the hotel by Fisheries In-
spector H. E. Hinton and John A.
Young, M.P.P. This afternoon they left
for Marysville to inspect the dam there
and later will visit Stanley. Indications
now point to fishways being installed
at an early date, although those op-
posed are bringing forward the claim
that the installation of fishways will
make it impossible to get sufficient
waterpower at Marysville for the pro-
posed pulp mill. Those favoring the
fishways scout that idea.

NOTED WEATHER

EXPERT IS DEAD

Cape May, N. J., Feb. 22.—Capt.
Theodore F. Townsend, one of the
most noted weather experts in this
country, died today at his home here
aged 74 years. For more than 25 years
he was the official forecaster at the
Philadelphia station and was transfer-
red to this point four years ago. He
was the inventor of many of the deli-
cate instruments now in use by the
weather bureau.
