SHERIFF'S THREAT FAILED TO FRIGHTEN MOTOR BOAT CAPTAIN

Failed in one attempt to land contraband liquor—Is waiting for another chance.

Eastport, Me., July 12.—Riding securely in the harbor at Welshpool, Campbell, is a low lying motor boat loaded to the gunwales with bottled liquors for which thirty Yankee threats are sizzling, waiting for a chance to make a second attempt to land the contraband cargo hereabout. One effort was made last week, but it ended in failure.

The motor boat started out from Lebec, bound for this city. A deputy sheriff, who had been tipped off that a cargo of liquor was about to be landed, secured a small boat and rowed out to intercept the incoming power craft. He boarded the motor boat and announced to the skipper that he was "captured" and ordered him to make all speed into Eastport harbor. The skipper laughed.

"Why, my good man," said he urbanely, "I'm bound for Welshpool, and unless you care to run down to Campbell, you'd better pile into your row boat and start ashore."

Then he started his engine and proceeded down the harbor, the deputy sheriff still being on board. The sheriff was perplexed, and then he had a sudden thought. Drawing his revolver he levelled it at the motor boat captain.

"Turn back for Eastport, or I'll shoot," ordered the deputy.

The skipper took his pipe out of his mouth and laughed. "Shoot away," he said pleasantly. The sheriff hesitated for a minute and then put his gun back in his pocket and looked sulky.

At this juncture something happened to the motor and the boat commenced to lose headway. The captain was equal to the occasion, however, for, halting a passing motor boat he asked for a tow to Welshpool. The stranger threw the line, but before the two boats had gone far, the deputy sheriff, who seemed full of bright ideas, stepped forward and cut it with an axe. He was very angry and his anger wasn't diminished when the resourceful skipper produced a chain which he made fast to the motor. The sheriff offered to tow him. They reached Welshpool without further incident, the sheriff at length jumping into his row boat for his long pull back to the city.

Still there have been some pretty good shipments, including 565 barrels of fresh mackerel, sixteen cases of tuna, besides a large quantity of other fish, in spite of all the drawbacks there is still some business moving.
