

WILSON OFFERS BATTLESHIP TO PRESIDENT-ELECT

But Senator Harding Has Made Other Plans for His Trip to Panama.

Washington, Nov. 5.—President Wilson today directed Secretary Daniels to place a battleship at the disposal of President-elect Harding for his contemplated visit to the Panama Canal zone.

The President also instructed Mr. Daniels to offer Mr. Harding, chief of the Presidential yacht Mayflower to convey him and the members of his party to Hampton Roads to go aboard the battleship.

MISSING OTTAWA MAN FOUND AFTER TWO WEEKS' HUNT

Ottawa, Nov. 5.—William Dougan, of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, who disappeared from his rooms on October 21st, was found today alive and fairly well.

He was discovered this afternoon shortly after two o'clock in the Pure Food Building at the exhibition grounds by Mr. W. Macdonald of Westboro. Mr. Dougan was recognized by Mr. Macdonald who was making some repairs to the hall and who took him to the police station, where he was questioned by Inspector Joliat.

BOSTON PAPER LAUDS SOLDIER LAND PLAN HERE

Christian Science Monitor Says Gain to Canada Likely to be Remarkable.

The Christian Science Monitor of Boston comments editorially on the operations of the Soldier Settlement Board of Canada, stating that its success is "most gratifying from both a national and international point of view."

After an examination of the Settlement Board's operation figures, the Monitor concludes: "From an economic point of view, the gain to the country from the development of this scheme is likely to be remarkable. Already the new acreage marked out for the cultivation of wheat is considerably more than half of the entire wheat area of the Dominion twenty years ago, and, expressed in terms of cash, it is expected to increase by something like \$50,000,000 annually the national wealth."

PALESTINE HAS A LIVESTOCK SHORTAGE

London, Nov. 5.—The scarcity of livestock, cereals and vegetables in Palestine is resolving itself into a serious problem, says a Jaffa despatch. The situation an agreement was arrived at with the Egyptian and Syrian governments for a monthly importation of 500 head of cattle, but by the time this was ready for consumption the price was found to be prohibitive.

POTATO SHIPMENTS ACTIVE ON P. E. I.
