Could the Prime Minister tell us what he had in mind when he mentioned a certain number of questions. Did he have in mind particular areas in respect of the constitution or is this a quantitative measure?

> Mr. Speaker: Order, please. I have some doubt whether this question is not a debate. However, we have a few minutes left before the end of the question period which might be used for the purpose of a reply from the Prime Minister.

> Right Hon. P. E. Trudeau (Prime Minister): Go ahead and ask your jumbo question.

> Mr. Stanfield: Perhaps the Prime Minister would reply, Mr. Speaker.

> Mr. Trudeau: The answer, Mr. Speaker, is that the amending formula has not come under consideration yet in the discussions between the federal and provincial governments. Government policy on this particular aspect will be formulated and announced in due course. We have not yet reached any conclusion on the kind of amending formula which could be used for either amending the total constitution or various parts of the constitution.

> Mr. Stanfield: Mr. Speaker, could the Prime Minister give us any more indication in terms of time when the government of Canada might be making the proposal or inviting the provincial governments to discuss an amending formula.

> Mr. Trudeau: We have always taken the position that the question of the mechanics of the amending formula itself would be at the end of the agenda, but of course if the provinces do not agree with this-and in certain cases they have asked that we study certain things other than those which we proposewe would be open to representation in this regard.
