Treaty concluded at Utrecht on the Fourth Day of April New Stile, in the Year of our Lord One thouland Seven hundred and Thirteen, between her late Majesty Queen Anne and the Most Christian King Louis the Fourteenth, it was among other Things agreed. That the Island called Newfoundland, with the adjacent Islands, should from that Time forward belong of Right wholly to Britain, and to that End the Town and Fortress of Placentia, and whatever other Places in the said Island were in the Possession of the French, should be yielded and given up,
