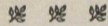

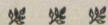


## Editor's Talk

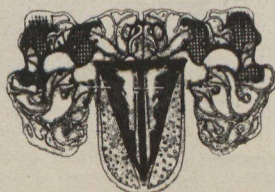

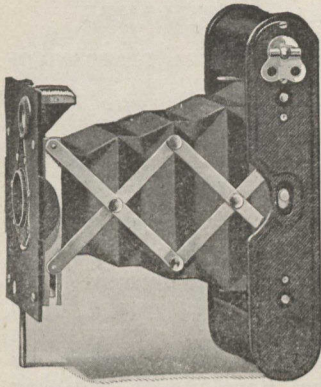

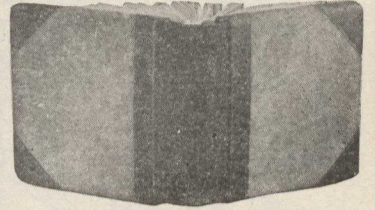
