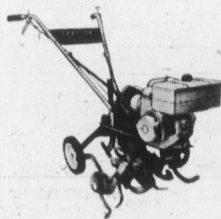

Giles Talbot Kelly of Toronto has been appointed director of the Sheridan College School of Design in Mississauga.

Kelly has been a consultant designer in private practice with textiles, printing, furniture, interiors, architecture, packaging and graphics since 1969.

For more than 20 years, he has been involved in full-time administration for art and design and has taught full-time at post-secondary, primary and continuing education levels.

He holds memberships in the Society of Industrial Artists and Designers, the Society of Typographical Designers and is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Arts.

In addition he was organizing consultant on design to the Minister of Education, Republic of Ireland, a member of the Irish Design Council from 1961-65 and is organizing secretary for the Society of Graphic Designers of Canada.

Down the corridors, yes, but not into the rooms

Women may have come a long way, the admen would have us believe, but in the realm of politics, they aren't doing so well. But that's excluding Flora MacDonald, MP for Kingston and the Islands, who is perhaps one of Canada's most celebrated women.

Speaking this week at Sheridan College about women in politics, the Progressive Conservative leadership hopeful said the sphere of political activity is still limited for women.

As an example, she said there was a notable absence of women at the recent national conference on energy in Ottawa.

"The conference was extremely important," she said. "It dealt with the potential of resources development, the cost and consumption of resources and it is women who have a very important role to play in these matters. But was there one woman there?"

"Women constitute the core of consumer society but are locked out," she said.

Miss MacDonald said that despite advances on some fronts, no one can say overall equality exists between the sexes.

Much of the fault for this lies with women themselves, she stressed.

Those women who have penetrated traditionally male institutions appear to shun exercising real power, she said.

"Women are somewhat reluctant to confront power."

"They seem to regard it as having some sort of bad connotation and they must overcome this feeling."

"Women can be placed in chief policy-making roles, but they must actively seek to do so."

Women, Miss MacDonald said, are still largely unfamiliar with the wielding of major power.

"I find it nothing less than shocking that four months of International Women's Year have gone by without the government introducing, let alone passing, any sort of wide-ranging human rights legislation."

"And various groups are still waiting for the government to do something," she said.

"I think parties in the expected Ontario election will go out and recruit women because they recognize the value they have."

"And I don't believe the process of women in power hardens them."

"It's a myth that should be exploded."

Politics is really "community-oriented," she said. "There is far more action outside the House of Commons than inside."

"Women can involve themselves in municipal government where mobility is not such a problem for a wife with children. It really starts from there and goes up."

In politics, she said you need, among other things, curiosity, stamina and self discipline. "It helps too, especially in the case of a woman, to possess a sense of humour. You have to be able to stand back and laugh at yourself."

"Women may have come a long way in many things, but we still have a long way to go. We may be walking the corridors, but we haven't penetrated the rooms yet."

The Council of the Corporation of the City of Mississauga proposes to pass a By-law to stop up part of the allowance for road in the City of Mississauga.

The following is a copy of the proposed by-law:

THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF MISSISSAUGA
BY-LAW NUMBER 184-75

A By-law to stop up part of the allowance for road in the City of Mississauga

WHEREAS it is deemed necessary to stop up the allowance for road described in Schedule "A" attached hereto and forming part of this by-law in order to provide for the realignment of Netherhart Road in the City of Mississauga.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the City of Mississauga, pursuant to Clauses C and D of Subsection 1 of Section 443 of the Municipal Act, R.S.O. 1970, Chapter 284, as amended, ENACTS as follows:

1. THAT the highways and parts of highways described in Schedule "A" attached hereto and forming part of this by-law are hereby stopped up.
2. THAT the soil and freehold of the above stopped up highways and parts of highways be offered for sale to the owners of the lands abutting for a sum and subject to conditions to be fixed by the Council.

SCHEDULE "A" TO BY-LAW 184-75
ALL AND SINGULAR, that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate, lying and being in the City of Mississauga, Regional Municipality of Peel, (formerly in the Township of Toronto, County of Peel), Province of Ontario, and being composed of that part of Netherhart Road as established by City of Mississauga By-law No. 10875, (Registered as Transfer No. 28940), being that part of Lot 7 in the Fourth Concession East of Hurontario Street in the said City designated as part 1 on a plan of survey of record deposited in the Office of Land Titles for the Land Registry Division of Peel (No. 43) as 43R-2674.

The above By-law will be considered by Council at a regular meeting held not sooner than one month after the first publication of this notice and the Council shall hear any person or by his Counsel, Solicitor, or agent, any person who claims that his land will be prejudicially affected by this By-law who applies to be heard.

He's elected treasurer of student group

A Mississauga high school student has been elected treasurer of the Ontario Secondary School Student Association (OSSSA) after a five-day conference in London, Ont.

John Coo was elected from the meeting of Ontario's 607 high schools following a week of seminars and policy sessions.

"We've learned a lot about how various student councils operate in Ontario," says Coo. "When we find out something — like a rock concert — that works well with one school, we pass along the information to other schools."

Coo says that OSSSA's original purpose was to provide a political voice for students and gain a student

bill of rights, "but now we are just trying to get more interaction between schools."

A good deal of the conference was involved with developing so-called "super-councils," combining the executive of several secondary school councils. The overall council could co-ordinate services and provide a stronger lobbying voice for students.

A London youth who heads the strong super-council in that area was elected OSSSA co-ordinator.

Another Mississauga student, Jeff Page was elected assistant co-ordinator.

Bill Paul of London, conference co-ordinator, said the effort was a real success because people would be going home from it "with lots of ideas for their own schools."

In March, representatives of nine city high schools met at Westwood secondary school in Malton to form the first Mississauga Student Association.

The aim of the association is to foster a closer relationship between students of all Mississauga high schools and between students and the community.

Schools expected to join are Clarkson, Erindale, T. L. Kennedy, Woodlands, Gordon Graydon, Lorne Park, Applewood, Glenforest and Westwood.

The two-day seminar is

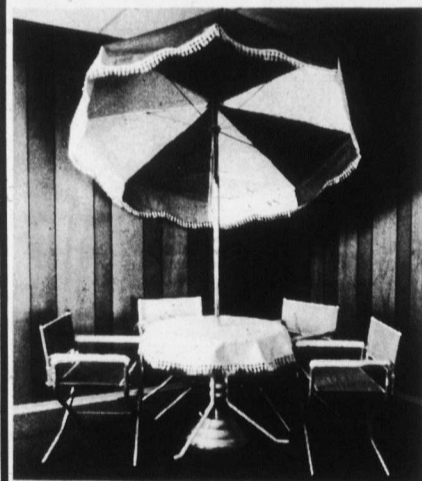
organized by the health sciences division of Humber college.
