Sir-

I beg to inform you that same little time ago Councillors John Martin and John Simpson, of the Caughnawage Band, called at the Department and requested to be furnished with a copy of the evidence of the Chiefs before Mr. Surveyor Walbank, under which the Department decided that the Giasson and Meloche families should be permitted to reside on the Reserve.

I beg, therefore, to enclose copy of the avidence asked for, and to say that you are hereby authorized to explain to the Council of the Band the ground, as disclosed therein, for allowing these families to reside upon the Reserve.
