- Q. What did you do with the remaining 400 dollars?
- A. I brought a truck.
- Q. Did you pay 400 dollars for this truck?
- A. That was a down payment.
- Q. What kind of truck was it?
- A. It was a 3-ton Ford.
- Q. How long did you keep that truck?
- A. Until they took it away from me. I couldn't keep up the payment on it because the roads were bad.
- Q. Was it because the roads were bad?
- A. I couldn't make any money to pay for it.
- Q. Can you give the Court any idea of how long you kept the truck?
- A. About six months.
- Q. Did you have any other employment during that six months?
- A. Yes, sir. I was hauling lumber and mine props.
- Q. Did you have any other employment?
- A. No, sir.
- Q. Where were you living at that time?
- A. Crows Nest Pass.
- Q. What type of house did you have there?
- A. I lived in a kind of auto camp, rooming house.
- Q. Did you stay there very long?
- A. Yes, sir, all summer.
- Q. Well, what did you do after you lost your truck, this 1941 ford, or as you said this 3-ton ford?
- A. I had enough money to get into a partnership with another fellow and hauled mineprops and lumber. We used his truck.
- Q. Where did you get this money from?
- A. I sold some of the furniture I had and got some money. I got around 100 dollars.
- Q. Couldn't you have sold this furniture and obtained this 100 dollars while you still had your own truck?
- A. Yes, sir, but I didn't want to.
