

He did not give any trouble when placed ^{under guard} and close arrest. He went to bed immediately. There were two guards at the door which was the short way from the streets to the billets. That is the only entrance which is guarded. When I checked the ~~soldiers~~ prisoners at 0900 hrs on 1 Nov. two were absent. ~~Could~~ the accused could walk out of the billets without the guard stopping him.

Reexamined

The men who were under arrest were mixed in the billets ~~without~~ with the others because there was no check. The four guards who were doing the guarding at the entrance door had the duty of guarding soldiers under arrest.

Questioned by the court.
Sgt. Halpern was not present when I placed him under close arrest after midnight. When I placed him under close arrest I did so by saying "The orderly Sgt told me to put you under close arrest". He said nothing in reply and went to bed.
