- (b.) Chapter 49 of the Statutes of 1912, being the "Water Act Amendment Act, 1912":
- (c.) Chapter 82 of the Statutes of 1913, being the "Water Act Amendment Act, 1913."
- (2.) Provided that every licence, permit, certificate, or other instrument made subject to the said Acts shall hereafter be subject to this Act.
- (3.) Provided further that such repeal shall not affect any rights acquired, or any liabilities or penalties incurred, or any act or thing done under any of the said Acts.
- (4.) Provided further that this section shall not be held to repeal the aforesaid Acts in so far as they apply to the Railway Belt until this Act is proclaimed by Order in Council to be in force in the said Railway Belt.
- (5.) Provided further that, notwithstanding the repeal of the said Acts mentioned in this section, the rights, powers, and privileges conferred upon power companies under the provisions of said repealed Acts, or any of them, to construct, operate, and maintain tramways, and to carry traffic, and to charge tolls, shall continue unimpaired as if the said Acts had not been repealed.
