All the females are with calf by Adanac, No. 190, Holstein Friesian Association of America and 153 Am. Br. N. H. H. B. The Canadian Coal and Colonization Co., (Limited), have ordered eleven 16-foot geared mills, one 14-foot geared, seven 10-foot, and one 12-foot pumping mills, eleven 7x10 foot tanks; in all twenty outfits. The above company have eleven farms of 10,000 acres each. Phey are also building six complete water stations, consisting of six 20-foot mills, six 50,000 - gallon tank, six 5-inch double action Curtis pumps, six setts tank fixtures, also delivering the C. P. R. an 18-foot Curtis pump; they are also working on an \$8,000 contract for the Shelburne village water works, consisting of a 30-foot windmill, 80,000 gallon frost proof tank, elevated 60 feet to bottom of tank. They put down the artesian well, which has a capacity of 40,040 gallons per day.
