MURDER OF FIVE MONKS.

The soldiers, having explored the cellar and having failed to find the door of the passage, came back to ask one of the monks to act as their guide, but they were nowhere to be seen. In the course of further investigations, however, they found the dead bodies of the eight monks in a small room, and the mystery was thus solved. The brigands, seeing that they could not escape, had murdered the monks and hidden their bodies in this room, having first stripped them of their clothes and put them on themselves. They then gagged one another to deceive the soldiers, and while the latter were searching in the cellar had made off to their fastnesses in the forest.
