In former years I have commanded native troops in India, and by their side I have been present in many battles and victories in which they have nobly borne their part; and it is to me a subject of deep concern to learn that soldiers of whom I had been accustomed to think so favorably should now be arrayed in open and defiant mutiny against a Government proverbial for the liberality and paternal consideration with which it has ever treated its servants of every denomination.

When I join the force now in the field restoring order to the district disturbed by the defection of the army of Bengal, I shall, as the head of the British troops, and of those native soldiers who, though few in number, have been ordered to separate themselves from their faithless comrades, and to adhere to their duty, feel my own confidence that they will march to certain victory.

I shall not fail to notice, and the powerful Government which I have the honor to serve will not fail to reward, every instance of fidelity and valor shown by the troops under my command.

I call upon the officers and men of both European and native troops zealously to assist in the task before us; and by the blessing of God, we shall soon see India tranquil and prosperous.

Colonel John Inglis, son of the late Protestant Bishop of Nova Scotia, was at last accounted, in command at Lucknow. The wretched Nena Sahib, with 35,000 rebels, was before that place.

There is nothing very new or startling from India. General Havelock has failed to relieve Lucknow, and great anxiety was felt as to the fate of the gallant handful of British troops in that town. Lucknow is not far from Delhi, and according to last advices it was beleaguered by 50,000 Rebels. General Havelock has won battle after battle, has indeed been victorious in every encounter with the Rebels, though his forces amount only to about 1,200 men. The brilliant achievement of the 78th Highlanders (related in another column under the heading, Campaign) will astonish the world. Nothing was done in the Crimea war equal to it.

Delhi it was hoped would be taken on the 20th August. The besieging force is receiving continual accessions. Some disturbances have occurred in the Bombay and Madras Presidencies, and serious apprehensions are entertained with regard to them. The Mutiny at Dinapore has had most mischievous results on the whole country between Cawnpore and Calcutta. It was all owing to the weakness of an old General Lloyd, and to want of ordinary foresight in Lord Canning.

The Treasury of the East India Company is becoming exhausted, and they cannot obtain loans except at exorbitant rates of interest. On the whole the news from India is not more gloomy than we were led to expect. It is rumored that Queen Victoria will shortly be proclaimed Empress of Hindostan.

The Bank of England has raised its rate of Discount from 5 to 5½ per cent. The disasters in the United States had had a bad effect in Britain, though not to the extent we feared. The Fast Day in Britain was observed by all denominations except the Romanists, who were called upon by Cardinal Wiseman to observe the succeeding Sabbath for that purpose.

Cholera has appeared in Hamburg and many other cities in the north of Europe, and preparations are being made in Britain for its reception. Men are setting their houses in order—cleaning their streets, &c. It is to be hoped that it will not spread much in this cool season of the year.

There has been another earthquake at Broussa, in Turkey, which destroyed a large part of the town. A Russian man-of-war was recently lost in the Baltic with 826 lives! Her name was the Lefort. She was turned over in a squall and sunk. This was evidently the result of bad seamanship.

MEETING.—The Temperance Meeting called for Monday evening, was held according to appointment. The day was one of almost continuous rain; a partial clearing up took place between 7 and 8 o'clock, and considering the darkness and damp and state of the streets, there was a respectable gathering in the room. Rev. Mr. McArthur, in consequence of delay in travelling, did not arrive at the time expected, but Rev. Dr. Cramp reached town, wet and weary, after night-fall. Like a veteran of Temperance he did not allow difficulties to keep him from duty, but repaired to the place of meeting and delivered an interesting and energetic address. He took various views of the cause and the evils it opposed, and urged to renewed zeal, to re-devotion in Temperance efforts. Well he might so urge, considering the experiences which afflict communities at the present time, arising from intoxicating liquors.

As some persons were returning from the meeting, they found in one of the principal thoroughfares of the town, a young mechanic, lying helplessly intoxicated, in the wet and mud, unable to rise to his feet. He was held up, and along for awhile, and went staggering to his home—his home!—The Doctor concluded his address by apt illustrations of the benefits which Temperance organizations should be, in the localities where they are established.
