AN ACT to amend An Act passed in the thirty fixth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act for making, repairing and altering " the Highways and Bridges, within this Province, and for other purposes."

Preamble. Act 36. Gro. III. Cap. VI. recited.

The Cities of Quebec and Montreal formed into two Diffricts, to be called the Town Diffrict,

To be fubject to the Rules &c. eftabifhed by the Act 36. Geo. 111. Cap VI. fo far as they are not altered by this Act.

Such Parts of the Parifhes of Quebec and of Montreal, not within certain limits to form a diffirét Diffriét, to be called the Country Diffriét,

The parts of the Parilhes of Quebec & Montreal to feperated, to b. under the direction & c. of the Jultices or the Peace I the faid Cities.

The Proprietors of Lands in the Country Diffricts

WHEREAS An Act was passed by the Le islature of this Province, in the thirty fixth Year of His prefent Majelty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for making, re-" pairing and altering the Highways and Bridges within this Province, and for other pur-" poles," And whereas the faid Act established regulations for the Towns and Parishes of Quebec and of Montreal, in the execution of which, divers inconveniencies have been found, occasioned by the too great extent of the faid Parishes; and whereas it is expedient, that other Provisions be made in respect thereof; Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legiflative Council and Affembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, conflituted and affembled by virtue of and under the authority of An A& of the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled, " An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majefly's Reign, intituled, " An Act for making more effectual Provision for the Go-44 " vernment of the Province of Quebec in North America, and to make further Provision for the " Government of the faid Province," And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the fame, that the faid Cities and Towns of Quebec and Montreal, shall respectively form a particular Diffrict, to be hereafter called, the Town Diffrict, and shall be circumscribed within the limits established for each of the faid Cities and Towns, by a Proclamation of His Excellency Alured Clarke, Equiro, then Lieutenant Governor of this Province, bearing date the feventh day of May, in the Year one thouland feven hundred. and ninety two, and in the thirty fecond year of His prelent Majefty's Reign.

II. Provided always, and it is hereby enacted, that the faid Cities and Towns of Quebec and Montreal, fhall continue respectively to be subject to the Rules and Regulations established by the Act of the Thirty sixth of His present Majesty, in as much as the faid Rules and Regulations shall not have been changed or altered by this Act.

III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, that fuch parts of the faid Parifhes of Quebec and of Montreal respectively, as shall be found without the limits fixed for the Districts of the Towns of Quebec and of Montreal, by the Proclamation aforefaid, of the feventh of the month of May, one thousand seven hundred and ninety two, shall become and form a diltingt and particular District, of the said Towns of Quebec and of Montreal, to be called, the Country District.

IV. Provided always, and it is hereby enacted, that the parts of the faid Parifhes of Quebec and of Montreal, fo feperated from the Districts of the faid Towns of Quebec and of Montreal, shall be, and continue under the direction and inspection of His Majelty's Justices of the Peace for the faid Towns of Quebec and of Montreal, refpectively, and shall be subject to such Rules and Regulations as are hereafter preferibed in this Act.
