URED OVER ONERS

...n. 29, via Lon- Saturday's battle Jacobe on the of the Roumanian asian troops captured y officers and more than 1- y men, the War Office announced today.

In their offensive movements in Galicia, south of Brzezany, the Russians captured and blew up a number of trenches held by the Turks, afterwards withdrawing to the original Russian lines, where attacks launched by the Turks were twice repulsed.

The text of the statement reads as follows: "Western front: In the Riga region the enemy's activity was limited to fire directed upon our trenches.

"Southwest of the village of Potutory, 6 2-3 miles south of Brzezany, our troops during Friday night gained possession, after bayonet fighting of the enemy's first line trenches.

"Notwithstanding a number of desperate counter-attacks by the Turks, which were repulsed with great enemy losses, our troops exploded six enemy mine galleries, demolished his trenches and withdrew to our original positions. After this the Turks twice attacked our detachments but were beaten back.

"During our occupation of the enemy's trenches we captured one officer and 28 men of the Turkish rank and file.

"Roumanian front: During the battle of Saturday northwest of Jacobe, southwest of Kimpolung, our detachment took prisoner thirty officers and more than 1,000 men.

"Caucasus front: The situation is unchanged."

CREW OF THE TABASCO SAFE

"Tabasco sunk last Friday, crew all safe," was the message received yesterday by Furness, Withy and Co., Ltd., from the Liverpool office of the Furness Line. Since the announcement in Sunday's press despatches that the Tabasco, on voyage to Liverpool from Halifax, had been torpedoed, there was considerable anxiety here as to the safety of Captain Moxon and his crew, most of whom had many friends here. The news that all have been safely landed will be very gratifying to these Halifax friends.

EX-GOV. McLELLAN, OF NEW BRUNSWICK, DEAD

Moncton, N. B., Jan. 30—Ex-Governor A. R. McLellan died at his home in Riverside, Albert County, at nine o'clock tonight. He was 87 years of age.
