yet wholly defensible one. And,  
moreover, had it been thus frankly  
made public we feel assured that no  
misapprehensions such as led to the  
comment "the Satellite and the  
criticism" of many other citizens  
would have been occasioned. The fact  
that Hon. Sidney Fisher was invited  
to open the Fair long before the  
Dundonald incident ever occurred is  
surely a complete vindication of the  
position of the directors as led to the  
comment after talking the matter  
over with President Austin, there ap-  
pears much force to the view that  
it is due as the people of a grand  
agricultural country to honor the of-  
fice of our Minister of Agriculture,  
and that no matter what may be  
our opinion of the present incumbent,  
our views of his treatment of a na-  
tional Scottish hero, or our disgust  
at his subsequent subterfuges and  
self-contradictions in Parliament—  
this much is due to the honorable  
office which he happens to fill; that  
we should greet, non-politically and  
heartily, by reason of what the man  
represents.

It is not the intention of The  
Planet in any of its departments,

criticisms elsewhere have been the  
strongest, to do ought to complicate  
the position of President Austin, of  
the Agricultural Society, or President  
Hadley, of the Board of Trade, or

THE FISHER VISIT.

To the Editor of The Planet:

Let some of your readers should  
be misled by the unfortunate insin-  
uation that appeared in yesterday's  
issue in the column contributed by  
the Satellite, permit me to make a  
statement in respect to the invitation  
extended to the Hon. Sidney Fisher  
to open the Peninsular Fair. Last  
year through the good offices of  
Mr. George Stephens, M. P., Hon.  
Sidney Fisher, accepted an invitation  
to open the Fair, but at the last mo-  
ment, owing to a pressure of parlia-  
mentary duties, (the House then be-  
ing in session) he was unable to come.  
After the Fair, when he wrote ex-  
pressing his regrets, Mr. Fisher stat-  
ed that should the Directors at some  
future time desire his services he  
would make a special effort not to  
disappoint them. When the Commit-  
tee of Directors met this year to de-  
cide on whom to secure they decided  
to again ask the Minister of Agri-  
culture to favor us with his presence.  
Accordingly I wrote to George Stephens,  
Esq., M. P., who was then in Ottawa,  
to interview the Minister on our  
behalf and also wrote Hon. Mr.  
Fisher, reminding him of his promise  
and as a result of these combined  
efforts he gave us a definite accept-  
ance at the earliest possible moment.  
It is to be regretted that anyone  
should endeavor to stir up political  
animosities and throw slurs at a  
minister of the Crown, who comes  
here as the guest of two non-political  
bodies, such as the Fair Directorate  
and Board of Trade are well known  
to be. In conclusion let me suggest  
to the Satellite that when in the  
proper time and place he wishes to  
make political capital, that he emulate  
the splendid example given by  
R. L. Borden, Leader of the Opposition,  
who carefully eschewed all per-  
sonalities in his address to the citi-  
zens of Chatham.
