HOME OF THE WARBLERS. Only Evidence of the Little Whisperers Their Mild But Penetrating and Insistent Notes.

When the woods seem most quiet and deserted soft bird voices often come in hurried whispers from the tree tops. These mild but pene rating and insistent notes seem to move and change with ventriloquial uncertainty, their source remaining persistently concealed. A quiet search may not reveal any other evidence of bird life, and absolute silence may be the only intimation that the little whisperer has gone elsewhere, says a writer in The Globe. A little form may move quickly across an open space among the branches, or there may be a hurried fluttering of tiny wings in confident indifference to intruders. A little fellow may move acrobatically about over the branches, twigs and leaves, gathering and gleaning wherever insects are to be found, or the trees about may become suddenly alive as the gleaners hurry here and there in their ceaseiess quest of food. The momentary apparitions reveal glimoses of bright color—yellow, orang pered, blue, green and olive—with striking contrasts of black and white, softened into rich browns and dull neutral tints.

That the woods are alive with a militude of beautifully colored birds is an interesting revelation, for the warblers, in spite of their gay plumage and active habits, are so small and retiring that they often pass unnoticed. The average Canadian who sees a case of representative specimens naturally regards them as importations from the tropics. But the summer home of the warblers is not in the dense tropical vegetation, but among the populars and conifer trees of new Ontario, northern Quebec and the Hudson Bay Region. There they repair every year to nest and rear their young, fed and also protected by the swarms of insects that make life intolerable for any daring intruder. Throughout the long range of their migration they are seen in the spring and fall, often in small and mixed flocks busy about the orchards and shade trees. They move slowly through the woods by day, but make their long flight by night, sometimes falling victims to the almiting failly in the most famil

And there are a host of others, richly colored, active and alert, traveling the leagth of the continent, the last to arrive and the first to depart, rearing their little broods in the inaccessible northern forests, feasting there on the abundance of insect life and returning to the perpetual summer of the Gulf States, the West Indies and tropical America.

CHANCE BROUGHT A FRIEND.

The police had made no secret of the facts leading up to the holding of the girl. On Monday, August 28th, Leonard Darch was arrested on the complaint of Edi.h Sindel, who was working here as an hotel employe, who charged that Darch had tried to induce her to lead a life of shame that he might share in the profits. Darch was sent to the penitentiary the succeeding day for a term of six months. He was charged with vagrancy. Capt. Collins had learned that Edith Sindel had left her home in North Bay to go to Toronto, and had not returned and had never communicated with her parents. It was decided to hold the girl till her parents were heard from, because of the dangerous situation the girl's ways might bring her to. A letter was sent to the Sindel home some days ago.

The other morning Fred Phillips, who rooms in a house adjoining the station house, chanced to see the girl's face at the cell window, and made enquiries about her. Learning who she was, Phillips said he had known her parents for some time. He went to the station-house, and after convincing Capt. Collins that he knew the girl, was permitted to see her. The girl was dumfounded when she saw Phillips. She told him her story in a tearful voice. He promised to furnish the transportation back to North Bty if the girl was released. His offer was accepted by the police and the girl left for Toronto Saturday afternoon, to go from there to her old home. Phillips is a cutter by trade and has been traveling through the country. He has not been in North Bay for fire years.
