Mr. Owen is setting before them a high Christian ideal and is teaching them that with Christ as their Saviour and guide it is possible for them to evercome their sins and so be good. The boys are kept constantly employed. They receive a good education and out-of-school hours their work consists in preparing fire wood for sale, beating carpets and working on the farm and in the garden. The garden is a large one and we saw it was stocked with magnificent vegetables and small fruit which find a ready market in Halifax. It is under the charge of an experienced gardener who has a number of boys helping.

E.s. Mr. Owen is finding suitable outside employment for some of the boys and this new development is likely to have a very good effect. These boys go to their business in the moraling and live in the school. At the end of the week when the boy receives his wages he hands them to Mr. Owen. This is kept for him, the pays a certain amount for his keep and the remainder is put into a savings account so that when he fin ally leaves the institution Mr. Owen is able to give him an outfit of tools and of clothes and so enable him to get a fair start. This has brought hope into some lives and now they are bright, happy, normal boys.


