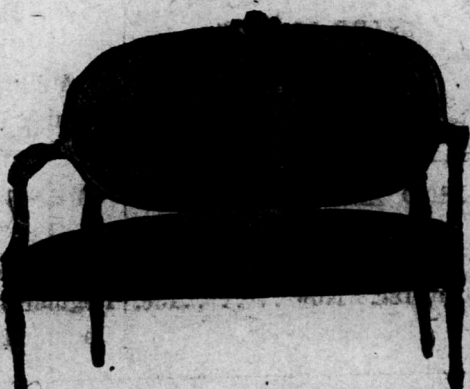

Special Evening Telegram.
HONG KONG, Aug. 15.
The Chinese manager of a secret
society of revolutionaries, whose
headquarters are in the province of
Kwan Tung, was arrested to-day.
Documents and badges found on his
person indicate that the revolutionar-
ies had selected their own officials to
succeed those at present holding
positions under the Chinese Government.
Great excitement has been caused
here in Chinese circles by this discov-
ery of a revolutionary conspiracy.

BELFAST, Aug. 15.
For the first time for many years
there was no demonstration here to-
day, on the occasion of the feast of
the Assumption. This was due to the
manifesto, issued by the officials of
the Hibernians, advising the abandon-
ment of meetings that had been ar-
ranged, and thus to avert the possi-
bilities of contact with the Orange-
men. Normal conditions have been
restored in the Belfast shipyards,
where for some weeks fights between
Roman Catholic and Protestant work-
men have been frequent.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 15.
It is said to be reasonably certain
that no further protest will be made
by British on behalf of the British
mercantile interests, against the Canal
Bill, if it finally takes the form re-
ported yesterday from the Conference
Committee. The British objection was
based on discrimination against Brit-
ish shipping. As such shipping will
not now be privileged to enter into
the American coastwise trade, which
alone is to receive favored treatment
in the Canal, that objection is over-
come. It is regarded as possible, how-
ever, that in deference to Canada, the
British Government may be led to ob-
ject to the prohibition against the pas-
sage of railway-owned ships, but the
Department officials would not hold
under the Treaty as the prohibition
is to apply to American vessels as
well as others, there could be no
charge of discrimination there.

TenorHas Opera House of His Own.

Signor Constantino, the Spanish
tenor, announces that he will open an
opera house of his own in Buenos
Ayres, September 20th.
The Teatro Constantino will be a
modern opera house in every particu-
lar. The building is a cement struc-
ture with one of the most beautiful
parks in Buenos Ayres at its threshold.
It cost \$255,000, subscribed by a syn-
dicate of leading citizens of Buenos
Ayres. It will contain an auditorium
accommodating 2,000 and be equipped
with seventy boxes; a restaurant and
rooms of the leading social club of
the city. The curtain, chairs and de-
corations were purchased in the United
States. Signor Constantino being a
patron of Uncle Sam's industries.
Signor Constantino will open the
house on September 20th with "Rigo-
letto." The season will cover twenty-
five performances of leading French
and Italian operas to be given in one
month. During the year the leading
opera singers will appear at the the-
atre on their way to and from Europe
and the United States. All the prom-
inent artists will appear and all the
leading operas will be produced.—
American Musical News Service.

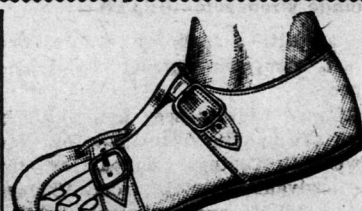
