## EARLY MESS

**SUBMARINE HUNTERS SUNK.**  
LONDON, Feb. 15.  
Eight British craft which were hunting submarines, have been sunk by a raiding fleet of enemy destroyers, it is announced officially. After having sunk eight vessels, seven of which were destroyers, returned rapidly northward before they could be engaged. The destroyer raid took place in the Straits of Dover, the official report says.

**THE RAID WAS SUDDEN.**  
LONDON, Feb. 15.  
Admiralty statement—A swift raid was made by a flotilla of large enemy destroyers at 1 a.m. to-day on our patrol forces in Dover Straits. The following craft which were occupied in hunting a submarine which had been sighted by patrol, were sunk—Dorset, Murray, Gloverbank, W. Elliott, Commo, Silver Queen, Veracity and Christina Craig. After having sunk these vessels the enemy destroyers returned rapidly to the north before any of our forces could engage them.

**TO OPEN WITH ROMANIANS.**  
AMSTERDAM, Feb. 15.  
Berlin newspapers of Thursday evening intimate that peace negotiations with Roumania are about to be opened.

**AGAINST NORTHERN RUSSIA.**  
LONDON, Feb. 15.  
Germany has resolved to renew military activity against northern Russia.

**TROTSKY'S ACTION APPROVED.**  
LONDON, Feb. 15.  
The Russians withdrawal from the war was a real withdrawal and a throwing away of all agreements with her former allies, said Leon Trotsky, Bolshevik Foreign Minister in reporting to all Russian Workmen's and Soldiers' Councils on the result of the Brest-Litovsk conference, according to a Russian wireless dispatch received here. The dispatch says the Council approved Trotsky's policy.

**WHAT GERMANY DOES WITH STRIKERS.**

A number of persons who took part in the recent strikes in Berlin have been sentenced to prison.

Love isn't strong enough to save people from unhappiness through each other's faults. Do you suppose that so many married people are unhappy in each other because they don't love each other that their faults are a mutual torment?—Howells. Should married people tell each other their fault and correct each other's unpleasant mannerisms? That is a question which all married people have to face sooner or later, whether they put it to themselves thus badly or not. The theory of an engagement is that each party is a being without faults. And then comes marriage. Then comes marriage and turns this illusion inside out. And these newly discovered faults, though not perhaps intrinsically large or important, are magnified by the powerful magnifying glass of noisiness, and made vital, as Mr. Howells suggests, by the very fact that the people involved do love each other so much. What then shall be done about them? Shall these twin seek to keep a hold on happiness by pretending never to have lost the illusion? Or shall they face the fact of their mortal, faulty quality and try to help each other to overcome? Of course this latter process requires much readjustment and infinite tact. But to my mind it is the only way to keep true love alive.

Why The First Year Is The Least Happy. I believe that this experience which comes during the first year is the reason why that year, instead of being the happiest, is one of the least happy in most married lives. I think it is a beautiful thing to have someone to help one overcome one's faults and correct one's mannerisms. I met a woman the other day who had one of those constant, nervous laughs that try the hearer so. It was plain that her husband recognized

ed the ugliness of this mannerism. Why wouldn't it have been much happier for him to tell her that she laughed too much. Surely she would have been helped to conquer this barrier between herself and popularity, and he certainly would have enjoyed her company infinitely more. Remember "Someone Is Married To One."

Of course any suggestions must be made utterly without self righteousness (remember "not only is one married to someone but someone is married to one"), in a spirit of helpfulness not of fault finding, in private, and with infinite tact. Also they should be accompanied by reassurances as to one's unchanged love.

And even then, so notable an authority as the feminist, Mr. George, disapproves. "There are ideal marriages," he says, "where both parties aim at perfection and are willing to accept mutual criticism. But there is something a little callous in this form of self improvement society."

## Your Boys and Girls.

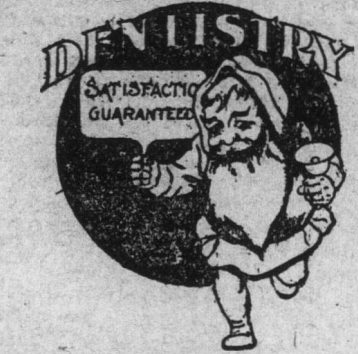
