Co-partnership With Employees.

BASE OF BUSINESS SUCCESS.
LONDON (Associated Press).—At the mammoth establishment of "Lever Brothers, Port Sunlight, Lord Leverhulme has long demonstrated to the commercial world that it pays to treat employees well. The co-partnership idea has been the foundation of his gigantic business. He has just carried that idea a long step further. His insurance policies will be taken out by the company for every co-partner in the firm, from laborers to directors. The policies of ordinary members of the staff will be worth from \$100 to a maximum of \$1,000; those of foremen from \$200 to \$2,000 and those of managers from \$400 to \$4,000. A system of grading is to be instituted to determine the amount of the policy allotted to each person. Devotion to duty and efficiency will lead to promotion to a higher grade and an increase in the amount of the policy, while for inefficient or careless work an employee may be graded down. Should an employee retire, with the company's consent, the company will try to arrange that he continue to pay the premiums. In the event of an employee leaving in any other circumstances, the company will try to secure that the assured person, if he so desires, shall continue payments of the ordinary rates without medical examination.

ADOPTED WITH ENTHUSIASM.
Under the unemployment scheme the firm will pay a co-partner such a sum as, with all allowances from other sources, will equal half wages. Payment will be paid on a similar basis in the case of sickness extending over a week. This benefit will be for four weeks, and its continuation will be considered. Lord Leverhulme explains the scheme to

a meeting of the employees, who adopted it with enthusiasm, said that it was not something in place of wages. The payment of trade union rates of wages was the basis of the plan, but the idea of the new proposals was to reward and encourage diligence and efficient service. "We feel," Lord Leverhulme added, "that there cannot be any greater stabilizing effect than that of removing the dread of unemployment and removing the possibility of pensions being left destitute in the case of the death of the bread winner." Lord Leverhulme spoke highly of the value of co-partnership. "The last two years of stress and strain that we have gone through in business have proved," he said, "that co-partnership is a sheet anchor in such a time. We may have adversity in the future, but I am certain that the co-partnership principle will come out triumphant and with flying colors."

Haitian Crafters Won't Quit Without Fight.

PORT-AU-PRINCE — The recent attempt to shoot Edouard Mangones, the Mayor of this city of 150,000 people, followed within 24 hours by the slaying of the Mayor of the city receiver, have created a sensation unusual for Haiti. The resort to firearms, together with tales of a mystery car with three gunmen operating at night, are new symptoms for Haitian politics. In the past, crimes of violence were usually accomplished by the secret use of poison or other methods. Since the occupation there have not been more than six murders and what may prove to be a crime wave is an unusual manifestation. Absolutely unknown in a century of Haitian local government is the determined campaign of Mayor Mangones, backed by the influence of President Borno and the American officer, gendarmes, to prosecute local officials, charged with shortage of funds, falsification of tax receipts, and graft. Mangones, a man of

means, an aristocrat and a business man, has created consternation among the politicians.

CLEANING UP DEPARTMENTS.
Last May he forced the resignation of the communal receiver for a shortage of \$5,000 in his accounts, the receiver claimed that his safe had been robbed of that amount three months before, although he had not reported it. Following that three officials were arrested for alleged falsification of tax receipts to the extent of several thousand dollars. Then came an investigation of Ludovic Monplaisir, Director of Cemeteries, who had long been an adherent of Mangones. In the course of it Monplaisir tried to shoot Mangones, seriously wounding one of his personal cabinet, Edmond Millet. The following morning the dead body of the new receiver, Clement Denise, was found. Whether his death was due to murder or suicide has not been established. Reports of a mysterious automobile complicated the situation, and gave rise to the theory of murder as part of a planned campaign of intimidation by the Mayor's enemies. On the other hand an investigation of Denise's office had been ordered for the following day by Mangones. Mangones has gone relentlessly on, whatever the truth of the Denise mystery may prove to be, and the Americans and other foreigners are delighted at this evidence of a growing civic responsibility. For more than a century local graft and malfeasance have been winked at, but Mangones, a man of personal courage and honesty, promises a continuation of his campaign.

Soviet Government.
CANCELS ORDER FOR LOCOMOTIVES.
STOCKHOLM.—After having ordered 1,600 locomotives from an engineering firm here, and having received 300 of them, the Russian government has intimated that it is now unable to pay. When the contract was made it was agreed that the engines were to be paid for as they were delivered, and the manufacturers obtained a guarantee for their money. It is now considered probable that the Soviet government will cancel the balance of the order, and that the present financial state of Russia and the future of the Genoa and Hague Conferences is responsible.
