

## LUNDY'S LANE.

Eighty-First Anniversary of the Famous Battle.

Five Thousand People Witness the Unveiling of the Monument at Drummondville

Niagara Falls, Ont., July 25.—The historical village of Drummondville was all en fete today, being the 81st anniversary of the famous battle of Lundy's Lane, and the ceremony of unveiling the monument lately erected to perpetuate the memories of the heroes who fell in defense of their country on July 25, 1814. The public buildings and private houses were all decorated with Union Jacks and bunting and presented a very fine appearance. All the known graves and trenches of the fallen were decorated with small Union Jacks and cut flowers, especially that of Laura Secord, the heroine who apprised the Canadians of the approach of the invaders.

It was estimated that fully 5,000 people crowded around the speaker's stand, which faced the monument, to listen to the speeches of the day.

At 12:30 o'clock the Lundy's Lane

Historical Societyentertained a number of their visiting guests at the Dufferin Cafe, in Queen Victoria Park, after which they drove in carriages to the

historical spot and took their seats on the platform. Among those seated were his Honor Lieutenant-Governor Kirkpatrick, Ven. Archdeacon Houston (Niagara Falls), Miss Carnochan (Niagara), Miss Fitzgibbon (grand-daughter of Capt. Fitzgibbon, the hero of Beaver Dams), besides a large number of well known

public men. Rev. Canon Bull, president of the society, opened the proceedings, and then introduced his Honor Lieut.-Gov. Kirkpatrick, who kindly consented to act as chairman for the day. In the course of his address the Lieutenant-Governnor alluded to the fact that it was the intention of the Government to erect monuments, not only on this historic spot, but also at several other places memorable in Canadian history; but it was most fitting to have the one in Lundy's Lane first unveiled, where loyal Canadians stood their ground pluckily against overwhelming odds. Though brave men existed in those early days, there were brave women as well, and none any dearer to Canadians than the name of Laura Second in connection with the memorable day. The speaker alluded to Gen. Drummond and his brave little band, who fought so bravely against overwhelming odds. In concluding his address the Lieutenant-Governor said: We do not meet here today to show any feeling of hatred for our neighbors, for we are proud of their prosperity and achievement, and expect them to be

proud of ours.
Col. G. T. Denison, of Toronto,
was present to represent the Dominion Government and unveil the monu-ment. After the colonel's address and the ceremony of unveiling, President McCullough, of the Hamilton Historical Society, laid a wreath of maple leaves one the base, when a mighty cheer went up from the assembly, and the Niagara Falls Brass Band played the National

Anthem. Addresses were given by Mr. German, M.P.P., representing Hon. R. Harman, M.P.P., representing Holl. R. Half-court, who was unable to attend; J. A. Lowell, M.P., Welland; Dr. Ryerson

writers of an essay of Ludy's Lane by the scholars of the public high schools of Ontario. Five had been received, and the poem written by Master Edward Miller, of Deseronto, Ont., a lad of 15 years, which was read, got first prize, while the essay of M. R. Kolter, of Stamford township, was second.

Canon Bull thanked all those who have so ably assisted in having the monument erected, and his Honor closed the proceedings by compliment-

ing the president and members of the society for the work done and thank-ing those present for taking part in the celebration. Three rousing cheers were given for the Queen and three more for his Honor.

The monument is built of granite from Stanstead county, Quebec. It is of a bright gray color and highly polished. It is 40 feet high, with an extreme width at the steps of 20 feet, and from its commanding position in the cemetery it has an imposing appearance. There is a vault underneath the
