American Troops Easily Defeat the Enemy-Aguinaldo Issues &

Proclamation. Manila, May 19 .- In the Catarm fight, Island of Samar, May 1, about 700 of the enemy attacked the men of the 43rd Infantry. The Americans killed 209 of the rebels, and by actual count only three Americans were wounded. Major John C. Gilmore and 100 men of the 43rd Regiment were ambushed on May 6 near Pambugan, Samar. Seventy-five of the enemy were killed, and there were no American casual-ties. Transport Lennox has returned here after landing four troops of the 11th Cavalry to reinforce Col. J. Frank-In Bell. The troops, Major Hugh T. Sime commanding, were landed at Legaspi, and proceeded across the country to strengthen the garrison at Ligao. They found numerous en-trenchments manned by Filipinos between the towns, and were two days on their way, skirmishing, dismounted, constantly. Their only loss was three horses. The officers report that they killed 40 Filipinos, but the natives de-

clare 80 were killed. A proclamation purporting to have been issued by Aguinaldo, and dated May 4, from Polillo Island, east of Luzon, is circulating in Manila. It says the commission appointed by President McKinley was appointed without the authorization of congress, and hence it cannot treat officially.
