NINE MILLS ON DOLLAR FOR BROUGHDALE SCHOOL

Ratepayers Were Greatly Surprised—Will Seek Agreement With City.

A largely attended meeting of the ratepayers of Broughdale was held in St. Luke's church last night to discuss the building of a school for the children of that suburb. Mr. Caleb Stockwell presided, and it was shown that to establish a school section, as was proposed, would make a tax rate of about 9 mills on the dollar, there being assessed property in Broughdale amounting to \$70,000.

Five mills over and above all grants made by the county council would be required to run the school, and four additional mills would be necessary for interest and sinking fund on debentures that would have to be issued.

It was stated that while there are about 60 children in Broughdale who would go to school if a school were built there, only about 30 are now attending other schools.
