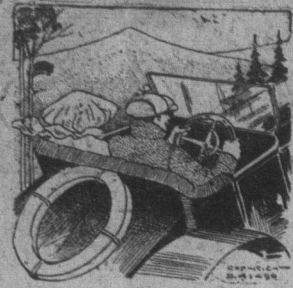

REPLACING THE INSULATORS

Hydro Commission Expected to Have Defect Remedied in Another Week

From the Hydro-Electric Commission comes the expected explanation for the power trouble which has been causing a serious interruption in the service since early this morning. It was found that the block of the juice was again provided.

For the past three weeks the commission has had large gangs of men working on the power lines, replacing the defective ones, but all the new insulators have been put in place. It is now a case of trusting to luck.

That the Hydro-Electric Commission will never be accused of sitting back and taking things easy during a time like the present is plain from the record made in driving the week over 30,000 insulators were tested and another day was completed the work. One hundred towers out of one thousand have been tested, and that had to be tested remain, and was, curiously enough, the insulators on these towers that caused the trouble.

Speaking of the situation, chief engineer, said: "There are ten thousand insulators on the line enough to complete the line from Niagara Falls to Toronto. At present we are putting them in ten as fast as we get them."

The commission has now 200 men working along the line, and to prevent any delay in discovering the location of a break in the week, must necessarily elapse before all defective insulators have been replaced. A patrol force has been employed and men are now stationed every mile along the line. These men, of course, are not all equipped with facilities for repairing a break, but the system has been organized by supplying and repair men are ready to go to the spot in waiting automobiles.

There are a dozen of these at along the line ready for any emergency. The motors are used to hoist the heavy insulators, only a few minutes being required to them in place once the men get to the spot.

The situation the Hydro-Electric Commission is now facing is unique, not only in Ontario, but in the continent, that the engineers "devise their own means of doing this. This is done by a special high voltage instrument, and method has shown such surprising results that the manufacturer of the insulators have asked to be allowed to patent it.
