Port'of Spain, Trinidad, July 31.—
(Correspondence of the Associated Press)—The revolutionary movement, which has been so long expected in Venezuela, has just broken out. Gen. Carlos Rangel Gardiras, formerly president of the senate under the presidency of Dr. Rojos Paul, rose on the 26th against the government of Gen. Cipriano Castro. It is said that he has raised the standard of revolt to cries of, "Vive el Mercho Hernandez!" At the moment of writing he is near San Antonio del Tachira. a town on the boundary of Columbia, with 4,000 to 4,500 men, who, the Venezuelan government admits, are well armed. Detailed accounts cannot be obtained, as martial law has been proclaimed, and censorship established all over the republic. According to official advices from Caracas, received last week, the insurgents have already been defeated by the government troops.

Death of W. B. Beach, "Father of the House of Commons."

London, Aug. 3.—William B. Beach, Conservative member of parliament for the Andover division of Hampshire, died today as the result of injuries sustained through being thrown from a cab yesterday evening into the excavations in Parliament street. Mr. Beach ranked as father of the House of Commons. He had sat in the House since 1857, and always for the same constituency. He was born in 1826, was a typical county member, educated at Eton and Christ Church, Oxford, where he graduated as B. A., in 1849, and M. A. subsequently. He was a captain of his county Yeomanry, the patron of two livings, interested in local rates, captain of the Oxford drag, was a magistrate and for 20 years was master of the Vine hounds, About a year ago he was made a Privy Councillor. His county seat was Oakley, Basingstoke, Hampshire.
