Last week we promised a statement in re the policy to be adopted at the Opera House and Imperial.

It is our sincere desire to establish a normal and healthy business in Campbellton, which we do not expect to accomplish over night. Conditions have forced us already to lose a great deal of money through an effort to establish ourselves in the confidence and good will of

the Community. We have two immediate One, to convince Campbellton that there is only sufficient income here for one theatre to make a living; and second of our desire and intention to treat our patrons fairly and candidly, and give them as good pictures for the money as can be found in any Town on the continent at

the same price. Ninety per cent. of the Picture Theatres in the Maritime Provinces are charging 20c and more! the balance will shortly be forced to advance their price, go out of business, or give poor pic tures. West of the Maritime Provinces, over ninety per cent. of the Picture Houses are pricing their shows at 30c and more. Under these circumstances, we. cannot sell first class picture programs in Campwith their cost in-

creasing rapidly-without | Matinee will remain unlosing money, anymore than can the Grocer sell sugar, the Hardware Man sell glass, the Druggist medicines and the Clothier clothes, for cost or less. If this were attempted would not our entire business structure become unhealthy?

We purpose doing business in Campbellton on purely business principles, and if it takes years to reach our ideal we can afford to At a date to be announced

for adults and 15c. for children four days in the week, and Wednesday and Thursday at the Opera House, for big special productions, 25c for adults and 15c for children, (on these days a program at regular prices, 15c and 20c, will be presented at the Imperial); although the latter arrangement is only experimental, as, if our patrons do not wish to pay this figure for the biggest and best pictures, for which from 50c to \$1.50 is being asked elsewhere, we will not insist upon showing them. It is our intention to gradually improve the appearance of the Opera House, and to bring more shows to Campbellton than before. When entertainments of any kind other than pictures are being staged at the Opera House, the regular picture show will be housed at the Imperial. It is also hoped to utilize the Imperial on other occasions, the details of which have not been worked out sufficiently for a definite announcement.
