RUSSELL SAGE ACCUSED.
A Woman's Sensitive Charge Brought Up After 25 Years.
 New York, July 19.—The World says: The fact that Russell Sage, the millionaire, is defendant in a suit to recover \$100,000 for betrayal under promise of marriage, was reported yesterday by proceedings of the Court of Common Pleas. The plaintiff is Miss Della Keegan of No. 433 West 125th-street. In her complaint she alleges that she came to this country from Ireland in 1868. Her sister was then employed as a cook in Russell Sage's house, and Miss Della went there to stop temporarily with her sister while she was looking for a situation. She alleges that Mr. Sage, who was at the time a widower, there betrayed her under promise of marriage, and then was cognizant of a criminal operation that was afterwards performed. Mr. Sage says it is a case of blackmail.
