While a freight train was being shunted near Richmond station yesterday afternoon, Mr. Robert Harris, car inspector, was standing on the track and was struck by a flat car, his body being caught by the axle and wheel around it. When extricated, one leg was broken in four places, the head crushed in and his body bruised. He died twenty minutes after the accident.
