## Scientific and Apelul.

A toop rule to follow when boiling corned beef is to allow half an hour to the pound after it has commenced to boil.

Ir any refreshments are kept in the sickroom they should be kept well covered. Jellies, Blancmanges and various liquids used as cooling drinks are more or less absorbent, and easily take up impurities which float about a sick-room.

POTATO SOUP.—Put two ounces of butter into a saucepan, cut two large onions into alices and fry a nice brown in the butter; add three pints of milk, and mix smoothly with it one pint of mashed potatoes, pepper and salt to taste; heat it almost to boiling point, and serve with dried herbs.

To CLEANSE HEN-ROOSTS,-To rid benroots and pigeon-loits of insect which prey upon the birds, put two cunces of sulphuret of carbon in a bottle and hang it uncorked in the hen-house or dove-cote. Replenish about once a week; the cost is small. It will not injure fowls. It is a French remedy, and said to be infallible.


