Sep 17-18-19 - Up with the Lark. though not much of a lark to be up so early. Circus horses brought round once more. To Station and of Westward Ho. To Winnipeg. Live in time for lunch. Capt Douglas at hotel. home in comfort and peace. a day. The Capt. be the man for that sum. out of Ral Port. and see town. der. full improvement since 1882. Quite a land, in view. the women all gone on the trip. then reches took with themselves. Only the solid men left. G. H.
