Mr. Valentine drew attention to the decentralized nature of cultural and academic administration in Canada, noting in particular the central role of the provinces, two of which, Quebec and Ontario, were represented on the Canadian Delegation.

Mr. Valentine expressed the hope that the work to be undertaken would reinforce the bonds which the cultural agreement has already fostered between Canada and Mexico.

The Fifth Meeting of Representatives agreed to conduct its work according to the following agenda.

AGENDA

- 1.- Assessment of the Cultural and Educational Exchange Programme for 1981-1983.
- 2.- Preparation of the Cultural and Educational Exchange Programme for 1984, 1985 and 1986.
- 3.- Establishment of general financing conditions to carry out the Programme.

As a result of its deliberations, the Meeting of Representatives approved the Cultural and Educational Exchange Programme between Canada and Mexico for 1984, 1985 and 1986, the text of which is attached as <u>Annex II</u>, and the general financing conditions for the Programme, which appears in <u>Annex III</u>. The Québec-Mexico Work-Plan prepared on August 18, 1983 is attached as Annex IV.

It was also agreed that the Sixth Meeting of Representatives of Canada and Mexico for Cultural Relations will be held in Ottawa in 198/ on dates to be fixed through diplomatic channels.
