2. Presentation (Mr. Benson),—That this House approves in general the budgetary policy of the Government, moved and debate adjourned on motion (Mr. Lambert, Edmonton West), 708. Debate resumed (1st appointed day); amendment (Mr. Lambert, Edmonton West),—Failure to contain incentives to eliminate inflation, unemployment and poverty: moved, 720. Subamendment (Mr. Saltsman),—Failure to reduce unemployment to less than 3% and implement certain measures contained in the Report of the Royal Commission on Taxation: moved and debate interrupted, 720. Debate resumed (2nd appointed day) and interrupted, 724-5. Subamendment negated on recorded division, 725. Debate resumed (3rd appointed day) and interrupted, 729-30. Debate resumed (4th appointed day) and interrupted, 732-3. Amendment negated on recorded division, 733-4. Debate resumed (5th appointed day) and interrupted, 758.
