### STUDENT LOANS

**Mr. Howard McCurdy (Windsor—St. Clair):** Madam Speaker, I have the honour and the duty to present

petitions which have been properly certified by the clerk bearing the names of some 3,000 students at universities and colleges in Saskatchewan.

They humbly pray and call upon Parliament to eliminate the 3 per cent tax on student loans, to increase the weekly loan limit, to keep the six-month interest subsidy, to respect the current limits for minimum course load and to maintain special forgiveness for students with disabilities on their total borrowing time.

The petitioners ask that the student loans program be amended to guarantee 100 per cent of student loans and to improve accessibility to student loans for part-time students.

### INCOME TAX ACT

#### MEASURE TO AMEND

The House resumed from Tuesday, February 23, consideration of the motion of Mr. Mazankowski that Bill C-92, an act to amend the Income Tax Act, the Canada Pension Plan, the Income Tax Conventions Interpretation Act, the Tax Rebate Discounting Act, the Unemployment Insurance Act and certain related acts, be read the second time and referred to a legislative committee in the Economics envelope.
