A book by Professor E.F. Scott, formerly of Queen's, but now of Union Theological Seminary, New York, is an event in the thinking world. His book on the Fourth Gospel has been pronounced the ablest in our language, and later works have sustained his high reputation. The forthcoming book on "The Holy Spirit" in the Early Church" will guide the whole Christian Church in her thinking on this vital subject.

Professor W.G. Jordan of Queen's is one of our clearest pulpit expositors of the Old Testament incidents, and one of our best known writers. His work has been favorably received over the English speaking world. The richest results of his life work will be found in the book here promised, "Ancient Stories and their Modern Interpretation".

Professor J.M. Shaw's book on "The Resurrection of Christ" has called forth enthusiastic commendation everywhere. Sir Robertson Nicoll places it first among recent books of that theme. Professor Shaw is following up this work by his book in our series on "The Christian idea of Immortality", and that it will be greater than its brilliant predecessor goes without saying.

Principal Hutton and Professor James Cappon are honored teachers who have given Canada their best, and the forthcoming books from their pens will be welcomed by readers through the whole land.

Among our younger contributors, Professor Richard Davidson and W.R. Taylor are Old Testament scholars of wide reputation and are influencing profoundly generation after generation of students in our centres of learning. Their books will take front rank among modern works on their subject. Professor A.J. Johnston is one of the most brilliant preachers in the Methodist Church. Professor Calandar has not only made a great reputation at Queen's but also among students in Bible lands through the world. And there are others whose works will be an inspiration to their readers.
