

Which will offer the slightest relief in the situation.

For the same reason let me remind you that it will not be possible next year to spare the students' laboratory in the College Building as liberally as we did this year, for we shall have, in the first place, more students in pathology, which means more groups and I must, in the second place, have the laboratory at my disposal for a longer period before my classes in order to carry on anything like adequate preparation.

I regret exceedingly to be obliged to make these requests, but it is impossible for an important scientific department of a University and equally destructive for its teaching and research to remain for several years in the present unsettled, unequipped and uncertain position in which the pathological department of McGill finds itself to-day.

I therefore ask you to be good enough to bring this letter to the attention of the Executive Committee of the Faculty and also of all those gentlemen who are directly concerned in it.
